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Dr. Chaya started the session with the comparison of the traditional method of teaching and flipped classroom and importance of practicing innovative teaching practices. She mentioned that the flipped classroom is a method with new concepts which occurs in an individual space and application of the content in an interactive guided group space.

The flipped classroom is an instructional strategy where students first encounter new material outside of class via lecture videos, practice problems. Worksheet, readings, exploration through activities and hands on practice. This method shifts from passive, lecture based learning to an active, student centered approach promoting better understanding and retention of material. By leveraging technology, it enhances learning experiences and allows instructors to offer more personalized support during class sessions. Dr Chaya also mentioned Bloom's taxonomy and flipped classroom model which consists of Pre-class preparation and In-Class application of knowledge through mini lectures, team-based learning, case based learning, large group discussion and think-pair-share etc. Each group was given a case scenario



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and asked to comment weather it is a flip of flop with reasons. All groups participated actively.
