

ARIVU (Education Loan) Scheme:

Internal Complaints Committee on Sexual Harassment

An open forum to discuss the challenges and expectations about gender inequality, gender-based violence and the insecurity faced by women, in the college campus. The Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee acknowledge the contributions of members of all sections of the academic community, students, teachers and staff representatives, women group and social activists.

Objectives

- Prevent discrimination and sexual harassment against women by promoting gender equality among students and employees
- Make recommendations to the Chairperson for changes in the rules, for students, in the prospectus and the byelaws, to make them gender-just and to lay down procedures for the prohibition, resolution, settlement and prosecution of acts of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, by the students and the employees.
- Deal with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner aiming at ensuring support services to the victim and termination of the harassment
- Recommend appropriate punitive action against the guilty party.

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Student's grievance Redressal Cell

The Students Grievance Redressal Cell of JSS Medical College, enables students who are aggrieved with respect to facilities / amenities in the campus, academic / teaching learning process, evaluation process, interpersonal issues related to student- teacher / student-student / student – administration or office or support staff to communicate using structured format available on JSS AHER Website.



JSSAHER has established a Student Support Centre with Department of Psychiatry and Clinical Psychology. The aim of this centre is to provide confidential direct one on one individual counselling services to all students for emotional well-being

A Student Wellness Committee is constituted comprising of student leaders from all constituent colleges and university departments to provide a barrier free student friendly approach to refer students in need of help. Faculty representing constituent colleges & departments will form a Student Committee (Faculty) who will identify students in need of support.

A dedicated Social Worker Mr Vishwanath has been recognised as the nodal person to coordinate activities of Student Support Centre.

The Department of Clinical Psychology and Psychiatry have made provision for students to contact any faculty of either Department through Tele-Consultation.



STUDENT COUNCIL

The student council is constituted to give students an opportunity to develop leadership by organizing and carrying out college activities and service projects and to promote planning events that contribute to college spirit and community welfare.



ANTI -RAGGING COMMITTEE

As per the University Grants Commission Regulations in curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 communicated vide letter No. F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated 17th June, 2009 an Anti -ragging Committee has been constituted. Staff members are assigned anti ragging squad duties regularly to check any kind of inconvenience caused to the students.

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INSTITUTIONAL ETHICS COMMITTEE

The research involving human participants are reviewed by the Ethics Committee, JSS Medical College to keep the research within the ethical framework and standards IEC upholds the task of review of all scientific, ethical, medical and social aspects of research proposals received by it in an objective, timely and independent manner by attending meetings, participation in discussion and deliberations. The IEC serves to protect the rights, safety and well-being of the research participants. The institution has provided adequate

infrastructure, staff, space, funds, required support and protected time for the member secretary which has helped in the smooth and independent functioning of the Ethics committee. IEC, JSSMC is involved in ethical review and approval of both the academic and regulatory clinical research proposals and functions as per the SOPs framed following the national guidelines. Since its inception, the IEC, JSSMC is consistently and progressively performing better year by year. This has been reflected by the good track record with the timely regulatory registrations and quality accreditations.

IEC, JSSMC was registered with Regulatory agency, CDSCO (Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation) in 2013. From then the IEC has been timely re-registered every 3 years i.e., 2016, 2019, and June 2022 by fulfilling all the regulatory requirements of CDSCO. Also, our Ethics Committee is Provisional registered with the National Ethics Committee Registry for Biomedical and Health Research (NECRBHR), Department of Health Research (DHR) in May 2022 for the approval of Biomedical and Health Research.

NABH Quality Accreditation of IEC, JSSMC :- Our IEC has fulfilled all the Quality requirements of NABH by undergoing NABH Accreditation inspection and received the Accreditation in April 2018, Surveillance inspection in September 2020 and Re Accreditation inspection in March 2021 and received the Re accreditation certificate which is valid from April 2021 to April 2024.

Presently, Our IEC, JSSMC is monitoring 85 clinical trials, including around 20 COVID-19 related Clinical trials. During the COVID 19 Pandemic, IEC continued all its IEC activities of reviewing and approving the proposals via virtual mode with simultaneous monitoring of the clinical trials with restrictions as per ICMR COVID-19 Pandemic guidelines. IEC, JSSMC is a multi-disciplinary and multi-sectoral team of 13 members with adequate representation of age and gender and balance between medical and non-medical as well as affiliated and non-affiliated members.

Dr.M.Srinivasa, Senior consultant, Kamakshi Hospital, Mysore is the Chairman of the IEC.

Dr. R.N. Suresha, Professor of Pharmacology, JSSMC was the previous member secretary of IEC, JSSMC, since July 2022. Dr. C. Prathima, Associate Professor of Pharmacology is the present member secretary of IEC, JSSMC, since July 2022. Dr Pratibha Pereira Professor and Head, Dept of Geriatrics, JSS Medical College & Hospital and Dr.Srinath K.M, Professor, Dept of General Medicine, JSS Medical College & Hospital are the clinician members. Dr. Kalabharathi H. L, Professor of Pharmacology, JSSMC and Dr. Smitha Rani Assistant Professor of Forensic Medicine, JSSMC are the Basic Medical Scientists. Smt. Sudha Phaneesh Secretary, Samarpana Trust, J.P. Nagar, Mysuru and Smt.H.S. Sandhya, Treasurer of Inner wheel club of Mysore Mid town are serving as Social Scientists. Sri. R.S. Nagaraj, Secretary, Shree Vanamali Charitable trust, Mysore and Dr. Sathyanarayana Mamatha, Assistant. Professor, Dept of Hindi, De Paul Degree College, Mysore are serving as laypersons. Mr. Palaksha and Mr. C.K. Rudramurthy are the legal experts. Dr. Sri Harsha Chalasani , Assistant Professor, Dept of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, Mysore is the Scientific member. Dr Shiva Prakash, Assistant Prof of Anatomy, JSS Medical


College, Mysore is the coordinator of the EC. Every member of the committee has been competent and has contributed to the effective conduct of all IEC activities with adequate institutional support.



CHILD ABUSE RESPONSE UNIT

The Child Abuse Response Unit was officially launched at JSS Hospital in November 2016. In child abuse cases, post-trauma care is very essential, and it often requires diverse medical

assistance. Caring for a child abuse victim needs multiple-department coordination. Hence JSS Hospital has taken the lead by setting Child Abuse Response Unit. The objective of this unit is to provide care in a manner that complies with regulations and also ensure safety of the child who is suspected or is reported to have been a victim of Child abuse. Various departments like Paediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Psychiatry, Forensic Medicine, Emergency medicine and nursing team are the part of this initiative who join forces following a single alert. A multi-disciplinary team is sensitive to the different problems and the whole process is kept confidential. Those patients who require such care, are immediately shifted to a private room and a neutral environment is created and one screening is conducted and forensic samples are collected. No multiple examinations are done thus minimizing the trauma to the patient. All the team members are trained in counselling, treatment, and well versed with legal aspects pertaining to such cases.

SAFETY CAMPUS

The JSS Medical college has ensured safety within the campus by appointing adequate number of security personnel and installing CCTV surveillance cameras throughout the campus. Total number of Security personnel – 89 which includes 4 Supervisors, 85 security personnel (65 men and 20 women) are involved in ensuring authorization of people entering the campus, inspecting the campus regularly, patrolling, reporting suspicious activity. They also provide guidance to navigate through the campus. Security staff were trained weekly by the authorised experts to ensure safe campus.

Brief Report of Two days Symposia SAMBAV: Health Professionals as Mental Health Facilitators 11th & 12th June 2021.



The psychological impact on millions of people due to COVID19 pandemic, can be devastating. The psychological impact can be from stress or economic socio occupational disruption and people may suffer from fear of infection, anger, anxiety, depression, suicidal ideation, increased substance use, or relapse of psychiatric disorders. This can be of great concern for India, which already has high mental health morbidity, with 197.3 million people affected which includes 45.7 million due to depression and 44.9 million due to anxiety, according to Govt of India, Indian Council Medical Research, global burden study 2017. There have been media reports about suicide related to the COVID19 scenario in India and case studies on self harm reported. More than 300 delegates participated in this unique online interactive program, facilitated by multidisciplinary experts in mental health from India & abroad led by Prof Mohan Isaac of University of Western Australia, who chaired and moderated the sessions. Dr Kishor M, Mr Sudheep PK, Dr Kiran Kumar K, Dr Vinay HR and Dr Praveen Kulkarni were the resource persons. Based on delegates' requests the proceedings of symposia are being made available on the official YouTube platform of JSSAHER










National webinar on "Challenges During COVID-19 Pandemic: Pharmacists' Perspectives''

Webinar on "Utilizing COVID-19 Pandemic to Strengthen the Dialogue of Access to Essential Medicines and Vaccines"

Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, Mysuru in association with Indian Pharmaceutical Association (IPA), Mysuru Branch, Mysuru conducted a webinar on the topic 'Utilising COVID-19 Pandemic to Strengthen the Dialogue of Access to Essential Medicines and Vaccines' on 12th August 2020 for the benefit of PharmD and M. Pharm Pharmacy Practice students. Dr. Sunitha Chandrashekar Srinivas, Visiting Professor, Rhodes University, Grahamstown, South Africa was the resource person. The webinar was organised with an objective to identify the need and the importance of access to essential medicines during this COVID-19 pandemic.

Dr. Sunitha Chandrashekar Srinivas, during her talk, she said "we find ourselves in one of the most challenging situations in history". As the pandemic increasingly affects countries with under- resourced health infrastructure and services, it is an ethical imperative to ensure that all people in all countries of the world are able to access essential medicines. This includes those medicines that are under international control. Governments should ensure that sufficient quantities of internationally controlled medicines, of assured quality, are available and affordable to people under medical care.

Throughout the duration of the pandemic and beyond the acute phase of burden on the healthcare infrastructure, it is critical that governments work cooperatively to ensure that no country, no region, no district, no city and no patient is left behind. Competent national authorities, manufacturers, suppliers and distributors play a crucial role in ensuring that internationally controlled medicines urgently needed for medical treatment are available within and across national borders. The supply chain is the foundation of quality medical care because without the necessary supplies, including essential controlled medicines, patients will suffer.

Also she highlighted that Governments are reminded that in acute emergencies, it is possible under the International Drug Control Conventions to utilize simplified control procedures for the export, transportation and supply of medicinal products containing controlled substances, especially in those cases where the competent authorities in the importing countries may not be operating at full capacity. Competent national authorities may permit the export of medicines containing narcotic drugs and/or psychotropic substances to affected areas even in the absence of the corresponding import authorizations and/or estimates. Countries should ease COVID-19 related transport restrictions for controlled medicines and consider local production solutions when feasible, to meet the COVID-19 driven demand spikes.


Further, she said about the adoption of the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS Agreement), many Health Assembly resolutions have requested WHO to address the impact of trade agreements and intellectual property protection on public health and access to health products. The

Global strategy and plan of action on public health, innovation and intellectual property, along with other relevant resolutions, constitutes the basic mandate for WHO's work in this area. As requested by the plan of action, WHO has intensified its collaboration with other relevant international organizations, in particular through



trilateral collaboration with WIPO (The World Intellectual Property Organization) and World Trade Organisation, as well as with other organizations, including UNCTAD (The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development) and UNDP (The United Nations Development Programme).

Trilateral cooperation with WIPO and WTO is fostering a better understanding of the linkage



between public health and intellectual property policies and enhancing a mutually supportive implementation of those policies. This activity area supports countries by fostering innovation and access to health products through appropriate intellectual property rules and management and by providing technical support and capacity-building.

Webinar on "Managing the Double Edged Sword: Antimicrobial Resistance and COVID"

Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, Mysuru in association with Indian Pharmaceutical Association (IPA), Mysuru Branch, Mysuru conducted a webinar on the topic "Managing the Double Edged Sword – Antimicrobial Resistance and COVID" on 19th August 2020 for the benefit of PharmD and M. Pharm Pharmacy Practice students. Dr. Sunitha Chandrashekar Srinivas, Visiting Professor, Rhodes University, Grahamstown, South Africa was the resource person. The webinar was organised with an objective to enhance the understanding on potential implications of some of the current management practices and practicalities of managing the novel coronavirus outbreak in relation to antimicrobial resistance (AMR).

During her talk, she said, "we are in the midst of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the most significant global health event since Spanish influenza in the early 20th century." She told that there are evidences in implementing draconian measures around the worldwide to try to slow the spread of the virus. Also, she said that the Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) and it has been cited as the most significant threat to the global health and global economy in recent years and which is now likely to be eclipsed by COVID-19.

Also, she mentioned that the emergence of COVID-19 also presents some important consequences for the development of AMR and with COVID-19 patients contracting secondary bacterial infections the use of antibiotics should be cautious and judicious. Further, she said that the use of antimicrobial soaps and disinfectant cleaners by members of the community and in the hospital will have increased hugely over the last few months and the higher usage is likely to continue, and may even remain high following the outbreak due to changes in infection and control policy or individual habits. However, she cautioned that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, higher concentrations of biocides are likely to be detected in wastewater treatment plants and receiving waters. This may increase levels of AMR in the environment, posing a human health risk for individuals exposed to these environments. Lastly, she concluded that the potential implications, both good and bad, of some of the current management practices and practicalities of managing the novel coronavirus outbreak in relation to AMR have been linked and the public and other stakeholders should be awake.






