
have given the institution a reputation for delivering significant service in the medical field. Alongside, corresponding stress was laid on investigative study and established the university as an important


To further substantiate its research mission, the university formed the Research Coordination Council as part of the Academic Council. The Research Coordination Council gives policy guidelines for conduct of research, award of doctorate degrees in research and also recommend to the academic council and constituent colleges to promote research activities. The said council at its various meetings has approved presently 52 faculty of the university and constituent colleges as research guides and has 148 research scholars for research leading to the award of Ph.D.

Any activity needs documentation and accountability to ultimately lead to recognition and in order to ensure that the several national and international publications by its faculty have created an impact amongst professionals and peers, the university carried out a detailed analysis of the various publications by the faculty in terms of its quality indicators as follows:


I Publication Trend

A look into the publication activity in journals present in 5 databases viz., Scopus, Web of Science, Embase, PubMed and Google Scholar.






The faculty of the constituent colleges published 1272 articles in 513 journals from 2008 to 2011 and the analysis brought forth a year-on-year increase in the number of publications as well as in the number of articles getting published in indexed journals reflecting the pursuing efforts of faculty in constantly upgrading their works as well as striving for excellence in all their endeavours.



II Indexing Analysis


How publications have been 'Indexed' and what is the ratio between Non-indexed and Indexed publications.

The h-index for the publications is as follows:



The publication analysis highlighted the importance of recognition at national and international level amongst professionals and provided the necessary guidelines for the faculty to further enhance their research activities. The analysis also brought forth the lacunae that can be filled by implementing stringent measures from the authorities in order to further motivate and inspire the faculty to undertake research activities which not only contributes to individual career, professional development as well as contribute to the vision and mission of the university.

The university also made several significant initiatives to promote research activity at all levels as below:

- Research guidance leading to Ph.D. and Masters degree in each faculty, research projects sponsored by central agencies, research publications in international and national journals and student projects/ survey reports.
- Formation of Research Advisory Committee, Research Coordination Council and the Doctoral Committee along with other subcommittees to promote and monitor research.
- Allocation of about 4% of the non-plan budget towards promotion of research activities and research facilities
- Implementation of the new (revised) regulations of the Ph.D. and Masters programme wherein thrust is given to publication of two research articles in peer reviewed journals before submission of Ph.D. thesis and open viva-voce.
- Recognition of all the Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors and Senior Lecturers as recognised Ph.D. guides.
- On an average, about 300 students obtain their Masters degree annually.
- Access and approach to all the research scholars to infrastructural facilities, hostel and library resources to support their research.
- Sponsored research projects from various national funding agencies like UGC/ ICMR/AICTE/ DST/DBT/RGUHS to enhance research initiatives and inspire

faculty for research.

- Nurturing collaborative research through international collaborations with universities abroad (USA, Malaysia and France) and also with industries
- As a result of these initiatives several teachers have received research awards, fellowship of academies and professional bodies adding to their career development and professional recognition.

Further, the University in its Strategic Plan has emphasized Research and Innovation as one of the pillars for excellence and has explained different strategies to promote and inculcate research in health sector much to the benefit of the community. These are apparent in the several initiatives made by the university as:

- 1. To identify its established areas of strength and focus available resources in those areas of research and doctoral study.
- 2. Develop such research strengths into national and international potentially recognised centres of excellence.
- 3. Attract faculty that will bring distinction and stature to the educational and research programmes of the university.
- 4. Encourage the existing faculty to enhance their special skills through lifelong learning.
- 5. Initiate collaboration with national and international universities, organisations and industry to conduct joint research programmes, provide consultancy services and carry out extension activities through NGOs
- 6. Identify all existing industry, institution collaboration and strengthen those which are working well. Identify key members from the industry and institution and encourage exchange of resources and knowledge.
- 7. To encourage faculty for publishing their research outcomes in journals, books and monographs, organize seminars and workshops on scientific writing.

Education is an endless journey through knowledge and enlightenment. Focus of the education system should be to train students to become autonomous learners and Schools must move from being educational centres to becoming knowledge and skill centres.

SPEECH BY DR. R. CHIDAMBARAM.

Principal Scientific Adviser to Govt. of India Medical Education and Research

His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Shivarathri Deshikendra Mahaswamiji, Chancellor of J.S.S University, Sri B.N. Betkerur, Hon'ble Pro-Chancellor, Dr. B. Suresh, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Members of the Faculty, Distinguished Invitees, Ladies and Gentlemen, and my Young Friends who are graduating today:

- 1. It is a privilege to come here to participate in the convocation function of the JSS University. It is a young University, just two years old, though JSS Mahavidyapeetha has created a chain of educational institutions across the country for spreading literacy, providing health care, enriching rural development, and most importantly imparting value-based education.
- 2. The great physicist Einstein once said "Most people say that it is the intellect which makes a great scientist. They are wrong, it is the character." This is a profound statement. This does not mean that any one can do great science. High intellect is necessary but not sufficient; character is more important. The definition of character is however, not easy. Character means integrity, it means pursuit of excellence within the individual's limitations, of course; it means perseverance in the face of adversity; it means commitment to national and social causes and it means also a commitment to justice and social equity. And character has to be inculcated not only in scientists but citizens in all walks of life during the period of education. The background spiritual ambience of this University ensures this.
- 3. JSS University has campuses in Mysore and Ooty medical colleges, hospital, dental college and hospital, and colleges of pharmacy there are not too many Universities in India, or in fact the world, which have campuses in cities of such spectacular scenic beauty. The JSS Medical Institutions have a long legacy of

- scholarship, research and education. And that is why I am very happy to be here with you today.
- 4. Medical research is an exciting field and the challenges here are going to increase in the post-genomic era. There is now interest in proteomics and structure-function relationship in proteins and nucleic acids; at a more holistic level, there is interest in tissue engineering and stem cell research. Fortunately, in India, we have strong groups who have specialised in the protein crystallography area and they can work together with medical specialists to study proteins relevant to diseases prevalent in India. The structure of any one of the hundred thousand and more proteins and enzymes related to the human system, if solved, can be published in a leading journal. But if the structures of the two or three dozen proteins important for, say, tuberculosis is solved then we can create an important knowledge base. This is still basic research but what I call 'directed basic research'. We are not asking them to develop an alternate drug for tuberculosis. This knowledge base on structures will be hopefully used by somebody else to do that, perhaps by designing the right inhibitor molecule. Medical scientists in Europe and USA are less likely to be interested in such studies because tuberculosis is not their disease, it is a tropical disease.
- 5. Last year's Nobel Prize for Chemistry went to a scientist of Indian origin, Dr. Venki Ramakrishnan, whose contributions include the determination of the structure of the 30S ribosomal subunit and its complexes with antibiotics, the role of the 30S subunit in decoding, and the high-resolution (Thermus thermophilus ribosome at 2.8 Å resolution) structure of the entire 70S ribosome complexed with mRNA and tRNA. Ribosome is the factory of protein synthesis. Dr. Ramakrishnan's work

- provides mechanistic details of protein synthesis, and helps understand antibiotic function at the atomic level. It also provides guidance for the design of new antibiotics.
- 6. The famous biologist Peter Medawar has said in his book entitled Advice to a Young Scientist. "Always work on important problems" Important to Science or Important to Society! And this is excellent advice not only for your young people but for everybody, even those who are not doctors or scientists, and even those who are not young! Dr. Venki Ramakrishnan's work passes this test on both counts it is important to science and it is important to society.
- 7. India is a large country, and therefore it should be present in every frontier area of science and of high technology. But how much we invest in any area, at any point of time, requires careful and wise analysis taking our national interest into account.
- 8. Allopathic medical treatment is based on symptoms, backed by pathological tests and imaging technologies. And the great advances in modern medicine are a proof of the success of this methodology. Since the human genome was deciphered and many diseases can be linked to defective genes, genomics-based personalised medicine is a future possibility, though the affordability of this to most of the population is still in doubt. Nanotechnology is having an impact on targeted drug delivery, e.g. of insulin, and my friend Prof. O.N. Srivastava sent me a paper from BHU scientists a few weeks back on a carbon – nanotube - based targeted drug delivery for even a rare disease like leishmaniasis. These are exciting areas of medical research.
- 9. But we also have to do extensive research on a holistic therapeutic

method like Ayurveda, which is getting increasing global recognition. There are several concepts and practices in Ayurveda which are testable by contemporary methods of science, but so far these concepts applying modern techniques have not been studied to any great extent. Most of the emphasis on research in this area has been on medicinal plants, herbal drugs, molecular (active principle) development, etc. Renowned cardiac surgeon and national Research Professor, Prof. M.S. Valiathan (who has published books on Legacies of Susruta, Vaghata and Caraka), has said that integrative initiatives are needed to strengthen this ancient knowledge.

Reviewing all the factors and research potential, my Office had organised two brainstorming session in 2006 attended by eminent experts from DST, DBT, AYUSH, leading research institutes and ayurvedic institutions, under the leadership of Prof. Valiathan. After considering the directives of experts, seven projects were sanctioned as 'Science in Ayurveda' projects under 'Directed Basic Research' and have given important results. An amount of Rs.50 crore was also recommended in the DST's budget in the report of the Steering Committee on Science & Technology for Eleventh Five Year Plan (2007-2012), which I chaired. Basic concepts of Ayurveda, related to Rasayana (Amalaki), Bhasma, (Rasasindur), Panchkarma, Dosha prakrities (human genotypes) and Dosha samanam activities of medical plants are being studied. Many of the projects have been completed.

'Science in Ayurveda' initiative has provided a common platform for modern researchers and Ayurvedic Vaidyas, boosting integrated research between scientific and Ayurvedic institutions. Based on the leads obtained through these projects and to further sustain such research, from April 2011, DST has worked out a regular scheme named 'Ayurvedic Biology'. A task force committee is constituted to work out suitable directives and recently the first meeting in this context was held at DST.

10. Infection and communicable diseases form a large part of the health care burden in India, in spite of the progress made with newer antibiotics and control programmes for life-threatening infections (such as HIV, Hepatitis-B, Hepatitis-C, etc.). Amongst these infections, the most distressing ones to treat are those that patients pick-up when they are in hospitals for surgical or medical reasons. Elimination of the possibility of infection, in totality, is a must in operation theatres. Towards this end, very strict and stringent operation theatre infection control measures need to be adopted. The above scenario prompted my Office to constitute, in April 2004, a Working Group on "Sterilization Practices in India" for looking at the current sterilization practices in voque in various medical establishments in the country, studying the attendant lacunae and suggesting the necessary remedial scientific and technological measures. This involves synergy between medical, microbiology and radiation specialists. In October, 2004, the Working Group submitted its report to our Office. The report deals with all relevant aspects of sterilization: the current practices in the country as well as the suggested remedial measures. The Working Group has concluded in its report that while all 3 popular forms of sterilization – i.e. autoclaving, use of ethylene oxide gas and use of gamma radiation – are useful, their use needs to be stringently regulated and monitored.

11. Another important concern is about the prevalence of spurious and sub-standard drugs and diagnostic centres in the country; of course, this is a global concern also. Our Office decided to constitute, in November, 2008, a Working Group to study and recommend the available scientific and technological measures to counter this problem. The Working Group interacted with the representatives of the major pharmaceutical associations of the country, the Pharmacy Council of India, the scientific and technical community and the industry involved in providing technology solutions to meet these challenges. In addition, the Working Group collected relevant

information on the subject from the concerned organisations in the USA and Europe. The Working Group then collated various scientific and technological measures already available, or those in the pipeline. Attempt has been made to evaluate their advantages and disadvantages. It may be pointed out that no single technology has yet been approved anywhere in the world to provide comprehensively a fail-proof measure for this purpose. The Working Group, likewise, has no preferred choice of any particular technology. In its report, it has only provided a comprehensive list of various alternatives, gathered from diverse sources, for the pharmaceutical industry to choose from, according to its own requirements. It is obvious that these technologies can only be supplementary to other regulatory, monitoring and legislative measures. Public awareness and empowerment are essential ingredients of any such programme. The Working Group's report was submitted to our Office in February, 2010.

12. Two thirds of Indians live in rural areas. And the poorer among them have little access to the kind of services most of us take for granted - transport, education and health. Rural health care delivery must interest all of us. Either some of you must go there physically or use modern communication technologies - mobile, wireless, satellite and optical fibre – for telemedicine. The National Knowledge Network (NKN), which is a multi gigabit, low-latency network, which the Govt. of India has sanctioned to connect all knowledge institutions in the country over the next couple of years – a few hundred are already connected – can be very useful in this context. NKN has been used for establishing virtual classrooms, research collaboration, remote access of advanced research facilities and so on. NKN can be used for sharing computer resources and databases, even across international borders. For example, a Neuro Informatics Project – a combination of neuroscience and information technologies – between India and Canada is in the pipeline.





To make India a developed country would require a range of efforts, in fact a variety of efforts even in the Science and Technology field – the choice of critical technologies based on technology foresight, the selection of R&D priorities, the human resource development initiatives at various levels, enhancing of academia-industry interactions, pro-active

selection of areas for S&T international cooperation, the policy initiatives of the government to improve the S&T environment, and so on. Each of these efforts must have synergy among the concerned parties and collectively there must be coherence among all the efforts. That is why I coined a new phrase a few years back: "Coherent Synergy". For India

to go forward rapidly, there is a need for coherent synergy in all our efforts.

I wish all of you young people all the best in the future, as you take up the fascinating challenges facing India.


































GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

Research has received a strong impetus since the formation of the University. The faculties from all the four constituent colleges have submitted many projects to the national funding agencies with many being sanctioned. The faculty also participated in several international and national conferences and workshops and published papers in international and national journals.

This year marked another milestone for the university as the first issue

of the JSS University Newsletter – JSSUNI was released. The quarterly issue showcases the activities in the university and constituent colleges, the achievements of faculty as well as students.

Yet another milestone was the publication of University journal - International Journal of Health and Allied Sciences (IJHAS). The first issue of the journal was officially published in collaboration with M/s Medknow Publications, Mumbai. The issue focused on original articles, case studies and original research papers in the disciplines of medical, dental and pharmacy. The editorial board has representations from all disciplines of Health Sciences not only from India but across the globe. The journal is indexed in several databases and intends to get listed among the top international journals in the world.

The university also published a Compendium of Medicinal Plants highlighting the research on medicinal plants such as antidiabetic, anticancer, antioxidant, antipsoriatic, etc. The compendium serves as ready reference to research scholars and scientists engaged in the field of study of natural products from plant extracts.

The University is also submitting several interdisciplinary research projects pursuant to the signing of MoU with several research organizations and institutes.

During the academic year 2011-12 the University and its constituent colleges submitted research projects to a tune of Rs. 2166.39 to various funding agencies and obtained research grants worth Rs.174.41 lakhs for 23 research projects sanctioned from the funding agencies.

The faculty of constituent colleges published a total of 313 research publications in various journals and presented 959 research papers in various national and international conferences and seminars. Students undertook several research projects funded by JSS University and other funding agencies.



1. JSS University ranked among top 20 universities in the country - The Pioneer, New Delhi Daily report, February issue based on several parameters like academic excellence, infrastructure facilities, placements and brand reputation of the 260 Central Universities, State Universities, Deemed Universities, and Private Universities of India.

- 2. JSS PHARMACY COLLEGES: As per the report published in the July 2011 issue of Careers 360, New Delhi among the top 25 Pharma colleges in the country, JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty was ranked 5th and JSS College of Pharmacy, Mysore, was ranked 13th pharmacy college in the country as per the Roll of Honour on proprietary Input Process Output methodology, which was based on a perception survey of deans of pharmacy colleges.
- 3. JSS DENTAL COLLEGE: Mr. Har Kaur and Mr. B M Gupta conducted a study to examine India's performance based on its publication output in dental sciences during 1999-2008, based on several parameters, including the country annual average growth rate, global publication share and rank among 25 most productive countries of the world. Research output, Impact, International collaborative papers and H-Index of the top 25 institutions in Dental Sciences during 1999-2008, were used for ranking institutions and JSS Dental College and Hospital, Mysore, has been ranked 13th best Dental College, with H index as 2, among the 240 Dental Colleges in India.





SUSTAINABLE RURAL HEALTH



The team has adopted a village called Suttur with a population of 41/2 thousand people, surveyed all of them for common health problems, looked into the prevalence of non-communicable diseases like diabetes and hypertension and documented all the details. The aim of the project is to see how best the health of the villagers could be improved. Policies laid down ensure that all the people of the village get free treatment at JSS Hospital Mysore. Even advanced treatment like heart surgery is done at much reduced costs and the ways in which healthcare is provided is quite comprehensive. They have established a hospital at Suttur itself with facilities for tertiary care. Equal importance is given by the community medicine department to improving awareness about various diseases.

The objective of Model Health Village, Suttur, is to develop a sustainable rural health model that can be replicated anywhere else in the country. Medical college hospitals can provide comprehensive health care to rural people replicating the same model. This can positively impact the health of the rural population which is large in number. They take the help of NGOs to hold large camps where basic health care and knowledge is imparted.



The university has also assisted with logistic and financial help whenever needed so that research work is carried on without a hitch.


Progress made:

- 1 Establishment of JSS Hospital at Suttur with the following objectives-
 - To ensure all residents would be free of communicable diseases.
 - To ensure all students of Suttur school would be free of dental caries.
 - To ensure all residents will have access to quality medicine at affordable rates.
- 2 The hospital has facilities for medical & dental treatment needs, minor OT and also a drug house where the drugs are available at subsidised prices for the poor.
- 3 A data bank of residents of Suttur has been planned and already implemented in a phase wise manner.
- 4 A research project on study of tribal health Jenu Kuruba tribe in Karnataka with special reference to Diabetes and Hypertension has been sanctioned from ICMR.

The University has enrolled a total of 150 students for the MBBS course and is the third batch of students who will graduate from the JSS University.





AREA OF RESEARCH:

AIRWAY DISEASES

DR. MAHESH P. A DR. JAYARAJ BS

The team works predominantly on asthma, COPD and lung cancer. Their work involves ascertaining genetic factors for asthma occurrence through scientific profiling. All this leads to development of better and more effective drugs and therapies for airway diseases.

The team has built up their work over the last ten years and has sharpened its focus more recently, providing crucial information to the international medical community; Especially information that has to be gathered in large families, which wasn't possible elsewhere in the world. The group has performed large epidemiological studies with house-to house surveys related to Asthma, COPD and Food Allergy involving more than 70,000 subjects to date. The team is also working at present on characterization of exhaled breath condensates in smokers and non-smokers with COPD and the relation of ADAM 33 gene polymorphisms on severity of asthma.

The group has several collaborations both national and international. Some of the key collaborators nationally are the Institute of Genetics and Integrated Biology, New Delhi, and University of Mysore. Internationally, there are significant collaborations with Imperial College, London, in the area of COPD and Leiden University and Amsterdam University, Netherlands, on food allergies. The team is also seeking collaborations in the US for studies on tuberculosis. Another significant step is the submission of a proposal on the development of needle-free injections for tuberculin testing.

According to the team, the phenomenal clinical material that JSS University has provided them has made research work easier over time. The team is developing a bio-bank of well-characterised clinical specimens in the field of asthma, COPD and lung cancer.

Progress made:

- 1 Signed a Memorandum of Agreement with Institute of Genomics and Integrative Biology (CSIR-IGIB) to conduct research work on Asthma, COPD and Lung cancer
- 2 Institutional ethical clearance has been obtained to perform the collaborative research work with IGIB. Collected and archived serum samples from 60 COPD patients and 30 normal controls. In addition, lung biopsies, BAL fluid and serum from 6 Asthma patients have also been collected. These samples are being analysed by scientists in IGIB for the expression of inflammatory markers and metabolites
- 3 In addition, tumor tissue from lung cancer patients is also collected and archived in the -80°C freezer.
- 4 A grant has been submitted to ICMR to study the role of NRF2 in lung cancer and to identify inhibitors for this transcription factor. It is currently under review.
- 5 Samples have been collected from large families with asthma for whole genome scanning in collaborative work with IGIB, Delhi. Serum is also collected for evaluation of inflammatory markers. Four large families with asthma have already been recruited for this study and have undergone a detailed clinical characterisation including spirometry and biological samples have been collected and shipped to Delhi.
- 6 Variations in ADAM 33 gene polymorphisms have been evaluated in the asthmatic population in Mysore and samples from more than 200 subjects and equal number of controls have been collected (ICMR funded study)
- 7 Prevalence of COPD in the urban area in Mysore is being conducted and has included more than 200 subjects so far. In a sample, exhaled breath condensate for evaluation of early biomarkers of COPD is collected.





PSORIASIS / DERMATOLOGY RELATED TO BIOMARKERS AND MEDICINAL PLANTS

This 3 member team has been involved in research in the field of psoriasis and its treatment through extracts of medicinal plants for the last 9 years, because medicinal plants are considered by Complementary and Alternative Medicine in the management of psoriasis. The chief objective is to tap the existing knowledge in sciences like Ayurveda. Given the public demand for complementary and alternative methods to treat Psoriasis and the existing literature suggesting some benefit, there is clearly a need for more rigorous randomised controlled trials, with meaningful and standardised end points, to determine the safety and efficacy of these interventions.

That being the background, the group has collaborated with various organisations, as acceptance levels for data collected are better if the research group has strong collaborations. For instance, the team has collaborated with the Pharmacy College for studies involving trials of medicines on animals, before they are administered to humans.

As the need to collaborate with people with a background of working with medicinal plants was felt, they collaborated with JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty and CFTRI.

Another objective to develop trace metals as novel biomarkers to understand psoriasis before and after treatment.

They have successfully collaborated with Department of Biotechnology, New Delhi, Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences.

The team has shown great internal coordination too, in terms of materialisation, conceptualisation and implementation. For the last 18 years they have been publishing their findings in high-impact national and international journals and have enjoyed acceptance worldwide.

Progress made:

Research Projects: Two research projects have been sanctioned by DBT and RGUHS for projects relating to the above research topic to the tune of Rs. 40.70 lakhs.

- 1. "A New Insight into Indigenous Medicinal Plants for Psoriasis control: Basic, Clinical and Molecular Approach" (DBT)
- 2. "Assessment of Serum Trace Element Homeostasis and the Complexity of Inter-Element Relationships in Psoriasis patients: Diagnostic approach " (RGUHS)

Two short term Research studentships have been approved and sponsored by ICMR, New Delhi

- 1. Application of Electronic Skin Biopsy Test
- 2. lectronic skin biopsy: A non-invasive technique for detection of psoriasis.

Hands-on training from 08-10-2011 to 16-10-2011

Report of workshop entitled "Handson training course on research methodology in formulation projects in biomedical research: from bench to bedside".

This workshop, sponsored by Govt. of India, Ministry of Science and Technology, Department of Science and Technology was successfully conducted by J.S.S.M.C., J.S.S.U. in collaboration with the Dept. of studies in Biotechnology, University of Mysore, at our college.

The workshop was conducted in 5 phases. In the 1st phase an invitation was extended to all the medical institutions in the state



informing about the DST sponsored workshop & requesting them to register for the same. In response to this more than 110 participants from various medical institutions registered & participated in the lecture arranged on 31st March 2011 at Sri Shivarathri Rajendra Bhavana, the auditorium of JSS Hospital, Mysore.

In the 2nd phase the participants were called to submit concept project proposals and as a response to this, 22 concept project proposals were received from various medical institutions.

In the 3rd phase, a pre workshop meeting of the candidates who had proposed concept project proposals was arranged in batches with the workshop co-ordinators and the candidates were given information on further improvements and development of the proposals.

In the 4th phase there were discussion meetings of the participants with the experts regarding formulation of biomedical research concept proposals wherein the participants presented power point presentation of the concept project proposals & the experts gave their guidelines for the improvement.

This phase included invited lectures by eminent scholars pertaining to biomedical research projects. The participants were highly benefited by their lectures which enlightened them about the various biomedical research activities which can connect the bench to bedside.

In the 5th phase the participants were given hands-on training in techniques which are commonly used in biomedical research. ELISA, Promoter reporter analysis & the various PCR techniques were carried out at the Department of Biotechnology, University of Mysore & the immune histochemical techniques was conducted in the department of pathology, JSS Medical College, Mysore.


All the participants, in their feedback, have given a satisfactory report about the workshop and have mentioned that the arrangements were good. They have suggested that such programmes have to be organised frequently so that more medical personnal will show interest to involve in research activities.



JSS Medical College faculty were actively engaged in research by making 92 publications out of which 26 were in renowned international journals, 66 in national journals and 10 in state / regional journals. The faculty, with a thrust on research, completed 2 research projects during the current year and submitted 28 major research projects to various national funding agencies. The College further got sanctioned 4 research projects from various funding agencies to the tune of Rs. 47.91 lakhs and Research grants worth Rs. 78,96,862.00 were received. 6 student research projects worth Rs. 0.45 lakhs were sanctioned from ICMR.

AREA OF RESEARCH:

ONCOLOGY/MOLECULAR PATHOLOGY

DR. JAYASHREE







The objective of the team's work has been to observe diagnostic and prognostic markers in various pathological lesions which help treatment stratification. The works are concentrated on stem cells involved in colon cancer, diagnostic and prognostic molecular biomarkers in carcinoma breast, dermatopathology, nephropathology and cervical cancers. These findings greatly help in determining the type of lesion and the stage of the disease to provide necessary information to the clinician to advocate appropriate therapy, as different types of tumors need different drugs.

The team benefits from collaborations with various universities. Presently it has Indo-German and Indo-US collaboration studies. There are many studies with the Biotechnology department of Mysore University. The group is also involved in digital image analysis with the L&T IES and with Nimbus solutions, USA.

JSS University has extended its support by inviting experienced research scholars to motivate and guide the team.

Progress made:

The studies with the Biotechnology department of Mysore University and Indo-German collaboration studies has progressed in establishing newer angiogenic markers including VEGF, VEGFR, FLT-1 and Tie -2 as having prognostic value.

The group working in dermatopathology has standardised immunofluorescent techniques since 2008. The DIF studies are a boon for patients suffering from immune mediated vesiculobullous disorders for treatment stratification.

The study group in nephropathology has standardised immunofluorescent techniques in the evaluation of renal diseases. A panel of antibodies consisting of IgG, IgA, IgM, C3, C1q, kappa light chains and lambda light chains are being evaluated.

The group involved in cervical cancers has established a manual liquid base cytological technique which helps in early diagnosis of these cases and thus prevents further complications involved.

The digital imaging analysis is at its initial stage trying to establish an alternative method in reporting IHC stained slides which helps faster reporting and overcoming the manual errors. The group has prepared a protocol for evaluation of software by correlating with the manual scores.

AREA OF RESEARCH:

HIV AND TUBERCULOSIS

DR. SUMANA







As TB is endemic to India and the country is a large contributor to the global epidemic, Dr. Sumana is attempting to contribute to the diagnosis and control of the disease. Diagnosing TB in HIV patients can pose a challenge, so she is involved in the development of alternate methods of diagnosis for such cases. The research is funded by ICMR. The impact she is hoping for is the early detection and stopping the spread of the disease to others in the community. In fact, she is also currently working on an Indo-Canadian project to develop an affordable, easy to use hand held TB and MDR TB tester for use in poor resource settings.

Dr. Sumana is also working on two other projects. One being leptospirosis, a deadly disease contracted from rats and domestic animals and the other, the evaluation of the sexual and reproductive system among villagers.

Progress made:

One project has been ongoing on -"Investigative workup of smear negative cases of Tuberculosis in HIV patients and antibiogram of Mycobacterial isolates".

Several papers have been presented in national and international conferences and seminars related to the above topic and few of them have won prizes.

Two articles have been submitted to be published in journals.



Cancer mortality rate being high as it is, the need to stem the disease is critical. This team works with the objective of developing cancer therapies through the stem cell based approach and develop pharmacological agents for treatment. They hope to develop early detection methods as well as better treatment and more effective therapies.

The study also involves determining the molecular mechanisms in diabetes and the efficacy of dietary supplements in the stabilisation of the disorder.

The team is also working on the study of the prevalence of malnutrition in school going children and the provision of fortified food for them.

Progress made:

- 1 Tissue culture laboratory has been set up
- 2 One research associate and two research assistants have been appointed for the Center of Excellence in Molecular Biology and Regenerative Medicine
- 3 PCR work is in progress

Ongoing projects:

- Isolation of colorectal cancer stem cells based on the biomarkers and testing the efficacy of Piper Nigrum as an anticancer agent for further use in translational studies
- Rapid and specific detection of Mycobacterium Tuberculosis DNA in blood of patients with pulmonary tuberculosis by polymerase chain reaction
- Detection of human papilloma virus 16 and 18 in oral squamous cell carcinoma by polymerase chain reaction using capsid protein L1 specific primer
- Evaluation of spectrum of mutation of beta thalassemia using ARMS PCR
- Clinical utility of estimation of urinary Nephrin as an early biomarker in Diabetic Nephropathy




Progress made:

The team has done an extensive study on Dhat syndrome.

Established a 'Depression Brain Bank', one of its kind in India, in which they study all the changes in the brain concerning biochemistry and genetics and also in collaboration with major centres like CFTRI, Mysore, IISc, Bangalore and Hyderabad Genetic Lab.

The team was responsible for one of the first comprehensive multiple parameter studies related to trace minerals as a cause for major depressive disorder, bipolar depression and schizophrenia.

Many publications have appeared in the above areas and the latter won the Marfatia Award in 2011 from the Indian Psychiatric Society.










They collaborate with the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), who supports them with funds.

JSS DENTAL COLLEGE AND HOSPITAL



(Quantitative Light Induced Fluorescence), which measures the minute amount of mineral lost from the tooth structure during the initial carious lesion using light induced fluorescence. The changes in the mineral content are shown digitally as changes in the pixel colour. The materials used for prevention and reversal of dental caries can now be tested for their effectiveness and efficacy within few weeks using the instrument. Conventional methods took longer time, of over a year, for the same process. With the faster testing protocol and methods developed by the team, the therapeutic and preventive products that are being launched in the Indian market can now be tested constantly and consistently. Such products and materials have to be tested for their effectiveness in the Indian scenario, Indian ecology and physiological conditions to suit the needs of the Indian population.

Dental caries is one of the most widespread oral diseases in the world. This team of dentists is working on developing a protocol for sensitive, effective, non-invasive and accurate method of diagnosing the carious lesions. The research includes the latest equipment called QLF

So, the objective of the team can be summed up as an endeavor to increase testing speeds and produce results faster, in both clinical and in-vitro tests.

The team believes that JSS University is committed to research, because the development of newer and innovative sciences applicable to medical and dental health can only be accomplished through research

Progress made:


Two projects (Colgate-Palmolive) on tooth hypersensitivity and tooth pain were completed to the tune of Rs. 7.94 lakh, associated with the industry.

The team's research objectives are two pronged. One, to assess the ability of newer Ayurvedic formulations on mitigating dentin hypersensitivity and tooth pain, and the second, to assess the efficacy of a commercially available Ayurvedic formulation for relieving dentin hypersensitivity over a period of time.

The impact they expect their research to have is to help in the development of newer, safe and effective formulations so that a wider section of the population could get the advantage of the relief obtained by a commercial formulation in managing dentin hypersensitivity.

The team collaborates with industries that manufacture dental formulations. This way they support each other in a symbiotic fashion.

They find JSS very conducive to research because they get tremendous encouragement from the university towards taking up research activities. Good working atmosphere, availability of clinical materials and paraphernalia and guidance from experts in the field of research are other factors that make JSS very supportive when it comes to research.

Progress made:

An international seminar was organised in JSS Dental College & Hospital on 17th & 18th December-2012. Dr Ananda P Dasanayake, Director of Graduate Research, New York University College of Dentistry delivered a lecture on Recent Advances in Dental Caries and Oral Systemic Disease Link. 





The Pharmacy College has achieved a milestone by undergoing ISO 9000:2008 certification by TUV Rheinland, Germany to add to the many accolades it holds.



New drug delivery systems, other than conventional ones like tablets and capsules, can make a drug cost effective, patient friendly and more effective. So, this team's objective is to make drugs more affordable by developing new ways to administer them to the patient. It could bring about paradigm shifts in the way drugs are administered. For instance, a drug that is given 4 times a day can be reduced to once a day. Further, novel drug delivery systems can also be designed where a single dose can be delivered on a sustained manner for a period up to 5 years. Innovations in this field such as implants, patches and micro and nano particle drugs have inspired the team to come out with new developments.

As JSS is a university, the team has more freedom to conduct research. They collaborate with government bodies and industries for their work and are also funded by them. The team has also published many articles in national and international journals and encourages team members to make presentations at national and international conferences, with liberal funding by JSS University.

Progress made:

- Six projects from various funding agencies like UGC, DST and ICMR amounting to Rs.82 Lakhs.
- 14 full time research scholars pursuing Ph.D.
- 4 faculty members submitted their Ph.D thesis in Novel Drug Delivery Systems.





Community Services/Initiatives

Clinical Pharmacy and Community Pharmacy Services: Clinical pharmacy services are offered in JSS Hospital, Vikram Hospital (Jeshta), Asha Kirana Hospital, Mysore and Vivekananda Memorial Hospital, Sargur. Services offered includes ward round participation, treatment chart review and patient counseling. Establishment of a drug information and consultancy service for all prescribers, development of parenteral drug administration guidelines, the introduction of an adverse drug reaction reporting system, development of antibiotic guidelines, preparation and distribution of educational publications and newsletters of drug and prescribing information are some of the significant achievements till date. Pharmacy practice postgraduate students participate in all activities including ward rounds, treatment chart.

Community services include medication dispensing, patient counseling and free health camp checkups (3 camps in the last academic year) for general public and university staff.

Poison Information Service to the healthcare practitioners of other hospitals and general public was initiated in this academic year. Objectives of this service is to provide information regarding management of poisoning cases to healthcare practitioners and first aid measures in case of poisoning to general public. Provision of hospital admission criteria in case of poisoning will also be useful in preventing unnecessary visits to hospital and thereby reducing the healthcare costs.

Department is identified as Adverse Drug Reaction Monitoring Center and also as Southern Regional Training and Technical Support Center for Pharmacovigilance Program of India. Through this the department is contributing to the development of national database of drug safety and assisting in capacity building and skill development of staff of other teaching hospitals in the southern region in the area of drug safety.



JSS COLLEGE OF PHARMACY, OOTY



The team's work revolves around Diabetic Retinopathy, Cancer (Cervical Cancer), CNS disorders (Schizophrenia, Cerebral Malaria, Alzheimer's disease). The objectives of the research work being undertaken is targeting better efficacy, reduced toxicity, improved pharmacokinetic profile and better therapeutic outcome using novel drug delivery systems like polymeric nanoparticles, lipid nanocarriers like nanoemulsions and solid lipid nanoparticles. They are also working towards fitting herbal drugs in BCS according to guidelines of various regulatory agencies. They have been doing considerable work in area of plant derived excipients for developing various dosage forms with an objective to develop low cost, biodegradable and biocompatible excipients.

Their most important objective is development of novel dosage forms for various diseases utilising novel strategies. There are several new chemical entities in preclinical and clinical phases but many of these fail in trials because of pharmacokinetic issues, solubility and bioavailability problems. Hence, the impact they hope for is to develop novel drug delivery system in order to improve the efficacy, specificity, tolerability and therapeutic index of existing drugs.

They have collaborations with various pharmaceutical industries like Biocon Pvt. Ltd., Apex Laboratories, Zim Pharmaceuticals etc. Our laboratory is being funded by various central government agencies like AICTE, CSIR, DST and DRDO.

The team feels that JSS University is conducive to research and other academic activities because of the constant support and encouragement from the management. Since it has been established recently, there is lot of energy and enthusiasm among researchers to make it a globally recognised university.

- 1 19 patents have been filed related to research on drug delivery.
- 2 Research grants worth Rs. 88.17 lakhs has been received from various funding agencies like AICTE, NAFETEC, DRDO-DIPAS, DST-(WOS-A), AICTE- CAYT
- 3 16 research papers have been published in reputed national and international journals with impact factor ranging from 1.09 to 4.7.

The objective of their research is to validate the traditionally used photoprotective herbs. Some fruits and herbs are used by the tribal people of Nilgiris to treat sunburn and photo aging. They fractionated the flavanoids from traditionally used Cyphomandra betacea fruits and screened it for its photoprotective activity using preclinical screening on non animal modal i.e. in vitro evaluation to quantify UV mediated DNA damage (DNA nicking Assay) in laboratory which is a simple and reproducible method. The formulation was found to be economical, effective and eco-friendly when compared to marketed sunscreen formulations.

The team has collaborated with Tribal Research Center (Govt. of Tamilnadu), Nilgiris to validate the traditional knowledge of tribes in photoprotective herbs and they are conducting training and workshops for tribal women on the utilization of these indigenous fruits and herbs in food application and home remedies. They have also collaborated with Himalaya Drug Company through student project work to utilisation these traditional fruits on food application.

The team feels that JSS University is conducive for research as it motivated and supported the faculty to compile and document nearly 20 years of research work in to 2 volumes of "Medicinal Plant Research Compendium" which is well appreciated by the research community all over. The University also encouraged the faculty and provided all facilities to start a natural product extract library, where they are preserving around 75 extracts and phytoconstituents for future reference and research.


Progress made:
